Current Challenges

- No exit-strategy (full dependency)
- Exploitation of data intrasparent/unclear
 - Profiling of institutions/faculties
 - Profiling of student groups
 - Increased surveillance of students and staff
 - Use data to train General Purpose AI such as ChatGPT?
- Awareness/culture about value of data
