Introduction to CEASG

The Centre for East Asian Studies Groningen (CEASG) is an inter-faculty institute launched by the Faculty of Arts and facilitated by Globalisation Studies Groningen (GSG) on 15 September 2014. CEASG initiates and supports interdisciplinary teaching and research on contemporary China, Japan, Korea and Mongolia, and strengthens and broadens the University's academic partnerships in East Asia. Where appropriate, special attention is given to the three research priorities of the University of Groningen: Healthy Ageing, Energy, and Sustainable Society.

Affiliated faculty represent the Faculty for Economics and Business, Faculty of Law, Faculty of Theology and Religious Studies, Faculty of Spatial Sciences, Faculty of Philosophy, and the Faculty of Arts. CEASG partners with various institutes and organizations in Groningen, including the Groningen Confucius Institute, the Centre for Japan Studies, Globalisation Studies Groningen, Groningen Centre for Education and Research Osaka University, and the Ubbo Emmius Fund. Through its academic staff, the Centre also partners with the Dutch Study Centre at Fudan University (Shanghai), the European Study Centre at Tsinghua University (Beijing); the Dutch Study Centre at Osaka University (Osaka) and the PNU-Groningen Research Centre (Busan).

The Centre coordinates the master's track East Asian Studies on the political economy of contemporary East Asia (MA IR, 60 ECTS) and currently develops a Bachelor's Degree Contemporary China Studies (180 ECTS). The Centre further initiates and facilitates grant applications regarding Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Mongolian and East Asian studies and facilitates lectures, seminars and conferences on contemporary East Asia at the University of Groningen.
